The STAR test is to monitor student progress – If the student's stats are low or high, the program moves the student to their ability level. It also coordinates with the student's Chromebook and the teacher's Chromebook.

There are curriculum guides from the district which aid the teachers in their monitoring of students.

Compass skills can also be practiced in Google classroom outside of class and are saved to the program for additional evaluation by teacher.

Read 180 is another evaluating tool for students.

SAT/ACT prep materials are accessible for teachers and students.

Vocabulary.com is available through the school for cross curriculum support and applies equally across all subjects.

Mrs. Conn explained that the department begins to work with seniors in the 2nd quarter of their senior year. The students must sign a contract showing where they are with graduation credits and what they still need. This contract is a net for the school showing that the student has been worked with by the counselor and understand what they need to do additionally to qualify for graduation. Students must have one online course credit which includes the HOPE class and an additional ½ credit online course.
