Cypress is also hard at work on the "ABCs" mentioned in our



last newsletter! Attendance, Behavior and Classroom Success are the focus of Advisement. Advisement groups meet every two weeks to discuss and track the ABCs. Please ask your Panther to see their "tracker". Thank you to our PBS team, staff and students for their constant focus on the positive and school-wide, consistent expectations.

Cypress also has the honor to be a Teaching and Learning school this year. We have been selected to be part of the FGCU Internship program. Eight of our teachers will host a level 1 intern this Fall from FGCU. It is an honor to work on a partnership with the University to grow the next generation of educators.

Counselor's Corner

HOW DO I SEE MY SCHOOL COUNSELOR?

Students: If you need to meet with your school counselor, please submit a Counselor Appointment Request in Castle. Our counseling department will review the appointment requests at the end of each day and you will be called out of class when it is best for your schedule by your school counselor. Finding the Counselor Request form:

- 1. Log into Castle
- 2. On the main page located the Counselor Appointment Request button
- 3. Select the + next to the button
- 4. Fill out the form including the reason, your counselor's name and a brief description of your request
- 5. Select the Submit button

SchoolMessenger Communicate(Emergency Notification System)

The School District of Lee County is moving to a new system to share important information from your child's school and the District. SchoolMessenger Communicate replaces the system currently known as Parentlink, but works very much the same way and enables us to send you emergency broadcasts, attendance alerts and event reminders. In addition, a companion app allows teachers and parents to directly communicate with each other, individually or in groups.

To sign up for your free account and download the app, visit **go.schoolmessenger.com**. Once you have an account, you can set your communication preferences for calls and emails.

There is also a way to receive text messages; however, under a rule by the Federal Communications Commission, you must opt in for that service. The process is simple and only takes a few seconds to complete. Simply text any <u>one</u> of these words—"subscribe," "optin," or "yes" — to the number 67587. You know you were successful in you receive the following reply message:

"You are registered 4 School Messenger notifications. Reply STOP to cancel, HELP for help. Msg&data rates may apply. Msg. freq. varies. Schoolmessenger.com/txt."

In addition to performing the opt-in process above, you will want to ensure that the District has your wireless number(s) in our student information database. If you have not already provided that information to your school, please contact them and provide them with that information.

The District will be officially launching the new SchoolMessenger Communicate service in October, so until then you will not receive any further text messages.

Please note, although the District does not charge you for this service, it does not pay for text message charges that may be incurred by you for sending or receiving text messages. Check with you wireless carrier for possible charges.

College Scholarship Opportunity for 9th Graders



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


Math Team
