



Counselors' Corner

Registration Process: Believe it or not, registration is coming up for the 2019-20 school year! Registration packets will be given to students this spring. Counselors will be meeting with all students individually to help them select courses for the 2019-20 next school year.

SAT/ACT INFORMATION:

Spring is a great time for juniors to get signed up for the ACT and SAT tests. We suggest that students take both tests to see which test they feel most comfortable with. The next SAT exam is March 9, 2019. The deadline to sign up is February 8th. You can register online at: www. collegboard.org. The next ACT exam is on April 13th. The deadline to sign up is March 8th. You can register for the ACT online at www.actstudent. org. Colleges will accept scores from either the SAT or ACT.

Tips for Seniors: One word: "Senioritis." Our advice to you is to try your hardest to beat it. Remember, your senior grades count. Seniors should be checking the Senior Google Classroom for important information, including scholarship opportunities. If you are still unsure about your postsecondary plans, be sure to put in a request to talk with your counselor - we are here to help!

FSA PREPARATION

The state developed the FSA portal and we encourage students and parents to visit the portal and try the "practice tests." The purpose of this is to become familiar with features, functionality and item types. This is an excellent opportunity to get comfortable with the "look and feel" of this state assessment required for graduation. You may visit this site by going to https://fsassessments.org/. Our District recommends using Google Chrome to navigate this site.

The FDOE also has updated PowerPoint presentations that parents may use to help prepare students for testing. The presentations contain much of the same policy and testing information found in the administration scripts and practice tests, to ensure students understand what to expect on testing days. UNIFIED BASKETBALL

Kudos to our unified basketball team, who, during winter break, became the first Lee County team to win a unified game! Sponsored by Special Olympics Florida, unified basketball teams are composed of 3 ESE students and 2 regular education students. Team members practice once a week and play teams from all over the state. Most recently our team played in Orlando and Naples. Special Olympics covers costs for these athletes, from travel, to uniforms, to referees. These teams are recognized by the FHSA, and have the chance to win a State championship in Basketball.

Cypress is now considered a Unified School since we have unified sports and are socially inclusive (and have been for many years). There are less than 40 Unified High Schools in the state, and we are one of only two unified high schools in Lee County.

WRESTLING

Over winter break the wrestling team travelled to Suwanee, GA for a tournament at Lambert HS. This is third year that the team has made the trip to Suwanee, and junior Aryeh Mehl upheld the standard of previous teams. Aryeh beat a Georgia state place winner en route to the finals.
