


the weather-- just beautiful!



#### School Safety: Update

Our campus now has a new security system at the front door leading toward the main office, as well as the Center office. Once school is in session, these doors are locked. Visitors should ring the bell at the front door to alert personnel, who will ask for a photo ID. Once the identification has been verified, the door will be unlocked. Please do not hold the door open for any person walking up behind you. Our team will take the time to verify the identification for these individuals. If you are coming early to sign-out your child from school, please allow additional time as we work through this process.

We are asking for parental help in promoting safe procedures while students are being dropped off or picked up from school:

- Front doors open at 6:30am. Please do not drop off students before this time.
- During the half-hour before school starts and the half-hour after dismissal, all cars exiting campus should turn <u>right</u> onto Panther lane. This will ensure a smooth flow of traffic.
- · Please do not drop off or pick up students anywhere other than the curb at the perimeter of our parking lot. Students should not be picked up or dropped off on Panther Lane.
- Do not leave your vehicle unattended at the curb at any time. Please park if you need to enter the building.

- TAG also traveled to UF and made beautiful music singing for the International Championship of Collegiate A Capella (ICCA).








Our Center students had a beautiful day for this annual event. They competed in two areas:


