

Social Emotional Wellness

The holidays can be stressful; take care of yourself with these tips from the American Heart Association:

- Positive Self-Talk We all talk to ourselves; sometimes we talk out loud but usually we keep self-talk in our heads. Self-talk can be positive ("I can do this" or "Things will work out") or negative ("I'll never get well" or "I'm so stupid"). Negative self-talk increases stress. Positive self-talk helps you calm down and control stress. With practice, you can learn to turn negative thoughts into positive ones.
- 2. **Emergency Stress Stoppers** There are many stressful situations— at work, at home, on the road, and in public places. We may feel stress because of too much work, poor communication, and everyday hassles like standing in line.

You may need different emergency stress stoppers for different situations and sometimes it helps to combine them.

- \square Count to 10 before you speak
- lacksquare Take three to five deep breaths
- \square Walk away from the stressful situation & handle it later
- Don't be afraid to say "I'm sorry" if you make a mistake
- 3. **Finding Pleasure** When stress makes you feel bad, do something that makes you feel good. Doing things you enjoy is a natural way to fight off stress.

Try to do at least one thing you enjoy every day for 15 minutes.

- □ Read a favorite book, short story, magazine, or newspaper friends
- lacksquare Exercise and/or Listen to music
- 4. Daily Relaxation Relaxation is more than sitting in your favorite chair watching TV. To relieve stress, relaxation should calm the tension in your mind and body. Some good forms of relaxation are yoga, tai chi (a series of slow, graceful movements) and meditation. Like most skills, relaxation takes practice. Deep breathing is a form of relaxation you can learn and practice at home.


Steam Roller Printing
