



#### Recently Moved?

We need to have your new address! Please send a copy of a utility bill (water, electric) or a signed lease with a copy of your driver's license to our Information Specialist in our guidance office.

Have you completed all information in the FOCUS parent portal? This is where you will list anyone that (over age 18) can sign your student out of school should your child be ill and you are unavailable. **Signing out your student early from class?** Please sign out your student at the **ATTENDANCE OFFICE** located at the Center of the Arts (next to the building marked "Theater") You must be on the students FOCUS account, and provide a current, government issued ID or passport to sign out a student.

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**Registration Process:** Believe it or not, registration is coming up for the 2020-21 school year! Registration packets will be given to students this Spring. Counselors will be meeting with all students individually to help them select courses for the 2020-21 next school year.

#### **SAT/ACT Information:**

The Spring is a great time for juniors to get signed up for the ACT and SAT tests. We suggest that students take both tests to see which test they feel most comfortable with. The next SAT exam is March 14, 2020. The deadline to sign up is February 14th. You can register online at: www.collegboard.org The next ACT exam is on April 4th. The deadline to sign up is February 28th. You can register for the ACT online at www.actstudent.org. Colleges will accept scores from either the SAT or ACT.

Tips for Seniors: One word: "Senioritis". Our advice to you is to try your hardest to beat it. Remember, your senior grades count. Seniors should be checking the Senior Google Classroom for important information including scholarship opportunities. If you are still unsure about your postsecondary plans, be sure to put in a request to talk with your counselor - we are here to help!

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#### **PBIS Model School**

We are **SO PROUD** to be named a PBIS (Positive Behavior Support Interventions) Model School. (The only high school in our school district to receive this award). Thank you to Dr. Adkins for the presentation and for TAG providing entertainment.

PBIS Model Schools must meet several requirements:

- Exemplify high levels of PBIS implementation fidelity,
- Demonstrate generally low rates of exclusionary discipline rates when compared to similar school types across the state
- Demonstrate equitable student outcomes

The School District uses PBIS to set of clear expectations for student behavior, consistent reward and incentive programs, make data-based decisions, and offer faculty support. The program emphasizes teaching all students desired behaviors that lead to increased academic achievement and a safer more respectful school climate. It also emphasizes the need for school staff to promote appropriate behaviors through explicit direct instruction, modeling, and reinforcement. Minor misbehaviors are viewed as teachable moments rather than discipline opportunities.

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
