The Recorded A Cappella Review Board (RARB) published their review of TAG's new album Six Feet Apart on Dec. 31 and for the second year in a row the album received a perfect over score of 5 on a scale of 1 to 5. Considering how last year ended, the fact that we were able to make an album at all is amazing.

"TAG albums have historically been a highlight for us at RARB, and Six Feet Apart is no different. It's a true testament to the strength of the program at Cypress Lake High School that the pandemic seemingly didn't affect the quality of this group's vocals or recordings, despite a lack of group rehearsals and an unusual recording setup."

"Starting at the top of the album, the energy given by the opening two tracks is unreal. More has a slick up-tempo groove that is headlined by soloists Isabella Sbarra Michelland and Wedler Lordeus. There is an amazing juxtaposition between



the heavily rhythmic patterns followed by large jazz chords that make it impossible to not move while listening. Break My Heart is a more club-like uptempo, but still a phenomenal display from soloist Annie Vardanyan. The energy from these songs is dripping through the speakers, and it's clear just how excited the group is to be singing these songs."


- Purple cards earned a 4.0 or higher

- Bronze cards improved their GPA by .5 from the prior quarter.


