# CYPRESS LAKE HIGH SCHOOL SAC Meeting - Quarter 2 November 15, 2021

Mrs. Holly Cosby called the meeting to order at 6:05. She welcomed all members and guests and thanked them for attending.

>School Improvement Plan (SIP)

Mrs. Cosby then introduced Mrs. Robinson and Mrs. Bond to present the School Improvement Plan (SIP) 2021-22. They explained that the goals are set by FSA Testing scores:

- ESE End of year testing scores will increase.
  Goal 21% of students will show proficiency on
- 2. Geometry EOC Scores increased

Mrs. Turner continued with an explanation of the updated high school grading system. This system will align us with the FLDOE. We have switched from percentage grades, with pluses and minuses, to quality points on a scale as follows:

**Quality Points Conversion** 

A 3.5 - 4.0 converts to a 4.0

B 2.5 - 3.4 converts to a 3.0

- C 1.5 2.4 converts to a 2.0
- D 0.5 1.4 converts to a 1.0

F 0.0 - 0.4 converts to a 0.0

This new system will benefit all students at CLHS.

Dual enrollment will still carry an extra .04 Honors and ACE classes will still carry an extra .02 Weighted grade adds in at the end of the semester. Some classes will not have a mid-term or semester test.

Mrs. Cosby then asked everyone to review the minutes from the previous SAC meeting. Mrs. Turner made a motion to accept the minutes. Mrs. Roles made a second motion. The minutes were unanimously accepted by attendees.

>DAC Report was presented by Sharifa King.

There was discussion about the bus driver walk-out in Lehigh Acres.

The board talked about the plan to redistrict the four zones in Lee County. The student population is constantly growing. At the time of this meeting the student total was 152,164. Seven alternatives are being discussed about changing the borders of these zones by 14+ - 112+ feet in order to make the student count more evenly divided. The decision is scheduled to be made on December 14, 2021.

Mrs. Robinson complimented Mrs. King on her review of the DAC meeting. The two agreed that if Mrs. King is unable to attend a DAC meeting at any time, she will notify Mrs. Turner, Mrs. Bond, or Mrs. Roles and they will contact the DAC alternate representative, Sara Dube-Garrett.

The next DAC meeting will be on November 17, 2021

### \*AICE General Paper

Several students scored a 96% pass rate last year, on the AICE General Paper test, in the spring of 2021. If these students get diploma recognition for this accomplishment, they will also receive a Bright Futures scholarship.

All juniors and seniors are in the AICE General Paper Class. This 2021-22 school year is the first time juniors have been included in this class. Before the next school year begins, more options will be added to include additional students.

#### \*ROBOTICS

CLHS Robotics hosted the first live Robotics FIRST Challenge Meet since March 2020. Seventeen high school teams attended an enjoyable day of running robots and competing. The Cydroids of Cypress Lake, in one round, outscored two of the best teams in our league. One of those teams was the #1 team in the state and the World Champions in 2019. The Cydroids held the top score until the last round and placed 3rd for the day. Congratulations to Mrs. Brauer and the Cydroid Team for also being recognized in a feature story on ABC7.

#### \*Panther Varsity Raiders

On Saturday October 30, 2021, the Lady Panthers and the Male Panthers both competed at the Lee County District Varsity Raider Meet.

The Lady Panthers earned 2nd place in Rope Bridge and Raider Fitness Challenge. They also received 3rd place in Tire Flip and Cross Country Rescue. The event rewarded the Lady

Panthers with a 3rd place overall in the competition and a slot at the Florida State Raider Meet on November 13, 2021. The Lady Panthers attended the Florida State Meet and placed in the top 5. Congratulations Ladies.
