





Choral MPA

On March 4th, Cypress Lake had the privilege of presenting the Choral MPA performances for all of the high schools and some of the middle schools in Lee County. MPA stands for Music Performance Assessments and it involves choirs from all over the county performing for 3 esteemed judges to be graded for several categories such as tone quality, technical preparation, and overall musical effect among the choirs. Superiors are the highest possible score that a choir could receive and allows for the school to have an opportunity to perform for MPA's at a state level.

Every choir over the course of those two nights showed incredible skill and quality. However, I would like to specifically focus on the Cypress choirs that performed. Cypress Lake has several choir classes to choose from, but only Chorale and Intermezzo performed at the MPA's this year. The Chorale program performed the pieces Verdun and Erev Shel Shoshanim, while Intermezzo and Chorale joined together to perform Turning and Canticle of Mary. Turning is a highly complicated song with several moving parts and yet it was performed on stage with an incredible overall sound that left the audience speechless. Verdun is a song that was sung in French and it was, again, very impressive to hear on stage considering the differing languages between other songs throughout the night.

Overall, the choirs did absolutely amazing and the overall sound and tone from the students speaks for itself, which is why it is understandable why both classes received straight superiors. The practice and professionalism from the choirs really showed through their performances and I cannot wait to see what is to come next year.

CLHS Goes to New York!

Along with five other schools in the district, the Cypress Lake orchestra department had the privilege of traveling to NYC for four days. Students had the honor of participating in a two hour clinic with the conductor of the New York Philharmonic, where he provided them with professional insight on how to improve the pieces they were working on together, while giving advice on how to improve overall as musicians. They also had the most incredible experience of being allowed to perform in the Cathedral of St. Paul the Apostle! Not only were they able to experience wonderful music related events, there was so much more! They were able to attend the famous musicals, Hadestown and Wicked, and experience the Paris Orchestra perform Stravinsky's "Rite of Spring" and "The Firebird Suite" in Carnegie Hall. They were even able to sightsee in the American Museum of Natural History. Their trip to New York City was definitely one that gave the orchestra family wonderful memories and experiences that will last a lifetime!



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
